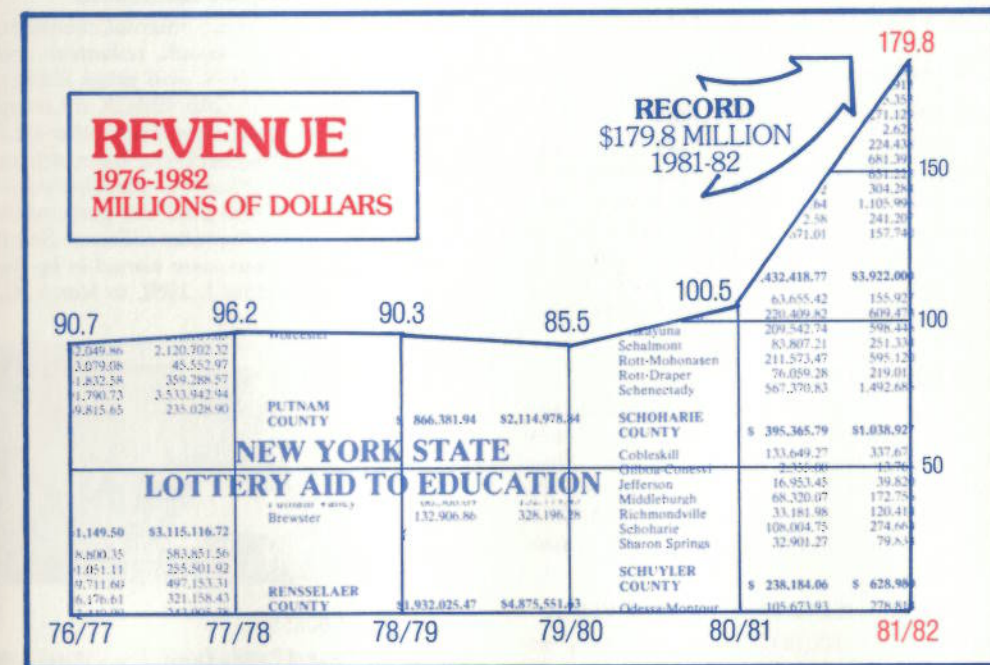
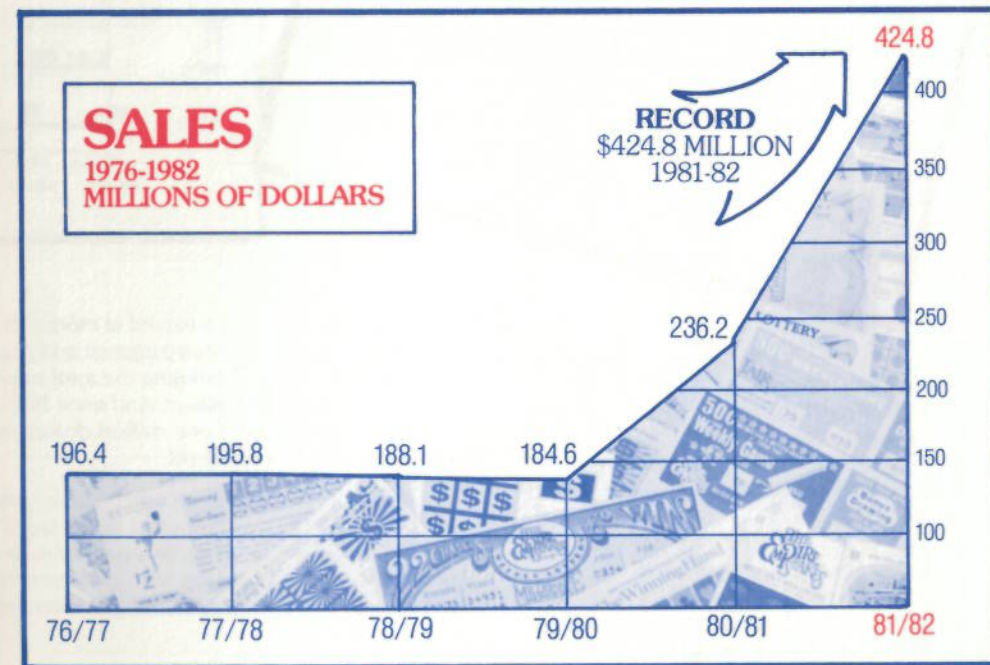

Here is how the Lottery's sales and revenues from September 1976 through March 31, 1982, break out on average, by the year, month, week and day:

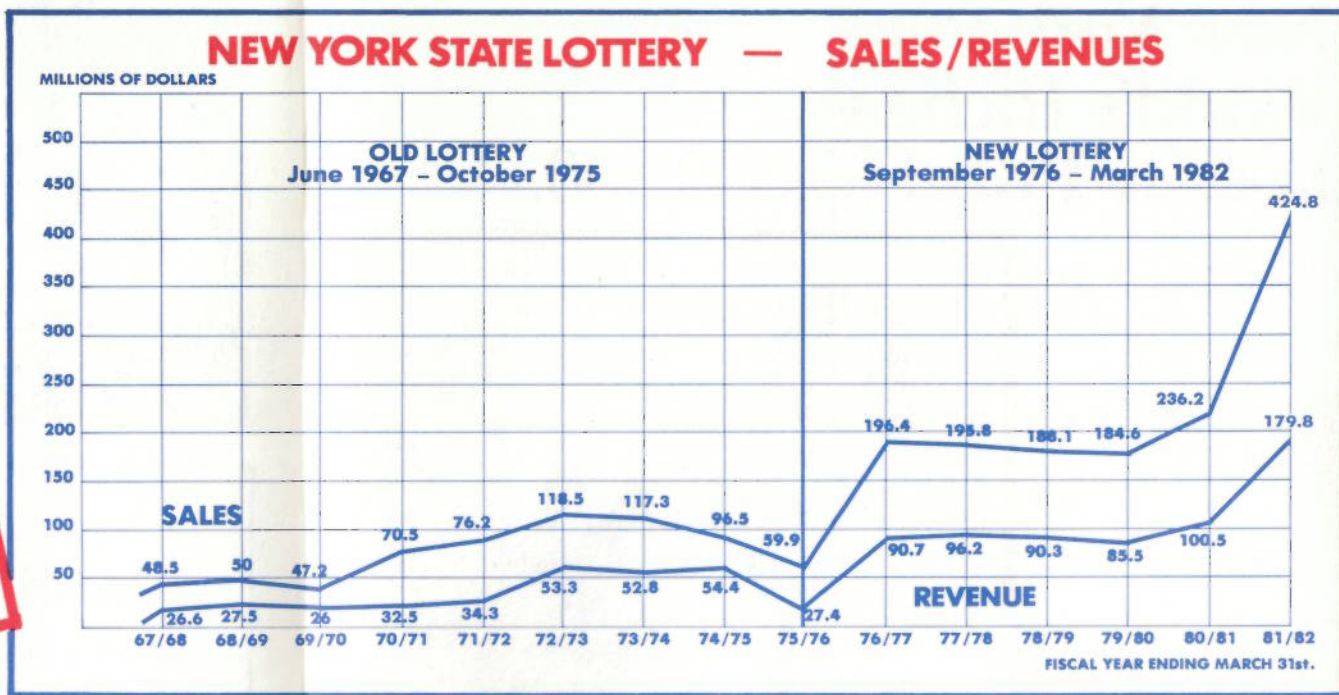
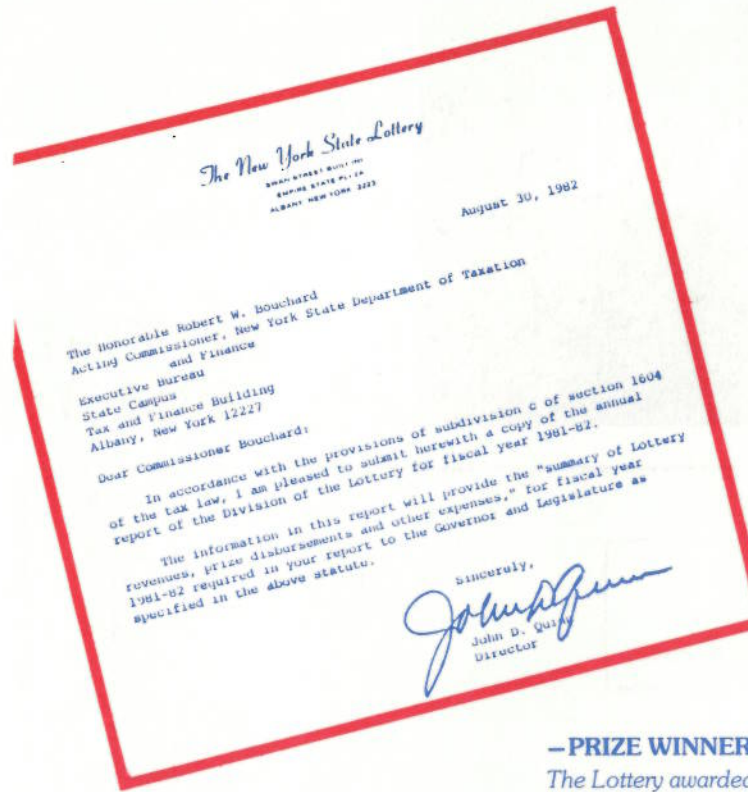

New York's Lottery sold more tickets and earned more money in 1981-82 than ever before.

Historic high sales of \$424.8 million were 79 percent higher than the best previous record of \$236.2 million the year before, and 130 percent higher than 1979-80.

Earnings of \$179.8 million for the support of local education were the largest ever.

Together, the sales and revenues earned for education were the highest ever since Lottery tickets were first placed on sale in New York State in June, 1967.

Many have benefited from the record setting year.

Among them were:

—REVENUES TO NEW YORK:

The \$179.8 million earned in 1981-82 increased to \$643.0 million the money raised for the State of New York by the Lottery since resuming sales on September 8, 1976. Of this \$548.3 million went to local education, \$90.7 million went to help balance the State budget in 1976-77 and \$4,000,000 went to the Special Olympic Trust Fund.

—11,000 AGENTS

More than 11,000 agents around the State earned in excess of \$25,000,000, an average of more than \$2,200 in profits for each location. Since 1976, when the "new" Lottery restarted, the "average" agent has sold a total of \$129,000 in lottery products and has earned \$7,740 in sales commissions.

—OTHER BUSINESSES IN NEW YORK

Approximately \$20,000,000 was earned by private entrepreneurs who distributed tickets to agents, served as contractors providing lottery games and provided supportive services to Lottery operations.

—PRIZE WINNERS

The Lottery awarded prizes valued at more than \$215 million (including annuity interest and free ticket prizes) in 1981-82, bringing the total since 1976 to more than \$683 million. And since 1976, 63 persons won prizes of one million dollars or more, including 18 in 1981-82.

The Lottery awarded what was then the largest guaranteed lottery prize ever paid in the world: \$5 million to Louis Eisenberg, an electrical maintenance man from Brooklyn who was earning \$225 a week at the time of winning, November 14, 1981.

—COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS

One hundred and thirty-two fraternal, charitable, civic, school, veterans, health, volunteer and other service organizations won prizes totaling \$162,700. They won in CASHBACK, a Lottery program for community, service and other local organizations who collected losing lottery tickets. More than 500 organizations participated in CASHBACK which also paid the participants one penny for each losing ticket collected. Some 7.5 million losing tickets were turned in by the organizations, from April 1, 1981, to March 31, 1982.



\$10,000 AGENT BONUS

Irwin Padnick, owner of Paddy's Variety Store, Cornwall (Long Island) has collected a \$10,000 Agent Bonus for having sold the INSTANT WINNINGS instant lottery ticket which enabled Michael Seaman of Central Valley to win \$1,000 a week for life.

The Lottery offered three types of games for sale during 1981-82. Here is a report on their sales and revenue to the State:

LOSING TICKETS WON FOR THEM

The prize money won by the New York State Knights of Columbus and the New York State Retarded Children's Association—first and second place winners in the Lottery's CASHBACK program—is going to help retarded children. In CASHBACK, the Lottery awarded \$162,700 in prizes to 132 organizations which competed in collecting losing Lottery tickets.

Here's the year-by-year report on sales and revenues earned for New York since the Lottery resumed ticket sales in September, 1976:

Several factors contributed to the success of the Lottery in 1981-82. Among them were:

—A growing popularity of the DAILY NUMBERS which added a WIN 4 feature in July and Sunday drawings in August, 1981.

—A burgeoning of LOTTO sales (from \$77.9 million in 1980-81, to \$149.2 million in 1981-82), much of it resulting from jackpot prizes that ranged from in excess of \$1 million to a then world record \$5 million won by a Brooklyn maintenance man on November 14, 1981.

—An increase in automated ticket selling locations for New York's NUMBERS and LOTTO to 1,496 by the end of the fiscal year—a sharp rise from the 547 when NUMBERS went on sale September 2, 1980 and the 1,048 in operation on March 31, 1981.



CASHBACK HELPS OUT

The Felician Sisters of St. Francis of Buffalo used some of their \$16,200 in winnings in the New York Lottery's CASHBACK program to help buy this van with a special lift that permits it to transport four wheel chair patients. The Felician Sisters care for their order's elderly and disabled nuns.
